

Ozark Highlands Trail – HWY 21 N for 19.6 miles, turn right onto County Road 5550 for 1.7 miles destination will be on the left.

Cedar Creek – HWY 21 N for 3 miles, right onto State Hwy 292 for 3.7 miles, left onto Hwy 123 N/164 E for 2.7 miles, slight left onto Hwy 123 N for 9.3 miles, then left onto County Road 5550/Forest Service Rd 1004 for 6.5 miles.



Bear Creek Falls - Find county road 1802 in Hagarville, off Hwy 123. Travel 2.2 miles down the road and park. Features 5 incredible waterfalls.

Pack Rat Falls Trail – Hwy 21 N for 3 miles, right onto State Hwy 292 for 3.7 miles, left onto Hwy 123 N/164 E for 2.7 miles, slight left onto HWY 123 N for 14.8 miles. Also features a rock-climbing boulder.

Pam's Grotto Trail – Hwy 21 N for 3 miles, right onto State Hwy 292 for 3.7 miles, left onto Hwy 123 N/164 E for 2.7 miles, slight left onto HWY 123 N for 15 miles.

High Bank Twin Falls - AR-215, Trail head across from the High Bank Canoe Launch.

Hurricane Creek – Hwy 21 N for 3 miles, right onto State Hwy 292 for 3.7 miles, left onto Hwy 123 N/164 E for 2.7 miles, slight left onto HWY 123 N for 16.2 miles, then left onto Big Piney Creek Road for 0.2 miles.

Ozone Trailhead – HWY 21 N for 16.8 miles, then left onto Forest Service Road 1456 for 85 ft.

Spadra Creek Nature Trail – A trail system that encompasses much of Clarksville. Access the trail at College Ave. just south of U of O's campus, downtown near The Levee, or at Iron Bridge located behind McDonald's and Dairy Queen on Rogers St.
